Patient FAQ

What is King County Project Access?

King County Project Access (KCPA) provides specialty health care to low-income individuals who do not have insurance. KCPA is based on physicians, community partners and hospitals volunteering their time and services to see patients for free.

Who is eligible for King County Project Access?

To qualify for participation in KCPA patients must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Patient typically falls in the age range between 18 through 64.
- Patient does not have health insurance of any kind.
- A patient's household combined income must fall within 200% of the federal poverty guideline.
- Patients must be referred by their primary care provider or a hospital or emergency department. After the referral, the KCPA Case Manager will schedule an intake appointment. Patients who reside in King County must be seen in King County.

What services are available to me through Project Access?

King County Project Access can help patients access a wide range of medical specialties including: dermatology, endocrinology, gastroenterology, general surgery, gynecology, hematology & oncology, nephrology, neurology, ophthalmology,

otolaryngology orthopedics, podiatry, pulmonary, rheumatology, urology. The list of specialties will vary depending on availability of providers.

Project Access may also cover the cost of laboratory tests, imaging and x-rays and durable medical equipment. Please note that KCPA does not cover Emergency Room visits or ambulance expenses.

Is there a limit as to how long a patient can be enrolled in Project Access?

No. The average enrollment in Project Access is approximately six months. Patients are rescreened for eligibility at that time if their medical care is not yet complete.

English is not my primary language. Does KCPA offer interpreter services?

On an individual and as-needed basis, KCPA provides interpretative services.
